
# Spain – COVID 19 Status - 28th April - Status

- 56.253 people have died,
- 210.773 are infected, more than 25.000 health professionals infected.
- 111.583 have been discharged
- The government has extended officially the confinement until 9th May.
- Daily confirmed cases are in the stabilization phase.
- Another positive sign is that the variation in growth of these cases from day to day is decreasing. In a month it has gone from a daily growth of more than 42% to less than 2%.
- Since April 26 children under 14 can make limited outings (one adult accompanying 3 children maximum - one hour per day from 9 am to 9 pm).
- De-escalation The plan to abandon the confinement will begin on May 11th and it'll last 8 weeks throughout the national territory, it will be "gradual, asymmetric and coordinated" and "there will be no mobility between provinces or islands until the new normal is reached." In other words, the permitted activities "can only be carried out in the province or island where we live".
- Every 15 days an evaluation of the situation will be made and new places will be added to the 4 phases that the President has outlined. Before, next Monday, May 4, a certain opening will be allowed in the Balearic Islands and 3 Canary Islands (La Gomera, El Hierro and La Graciosa).




# Spain - COVID 19 Status - 28th April - Status

The coronavirus outbreak has drastically changed many aspects of society's every day life, including the way we work. Spain, severely affected by the pandemic, had to transform the way its workforce operated to curb the spread of the coronavirus just like many other countries in the world. As of April 2020, almost 30 percent of Spain's workers were required to do home office and resume activity as usual. Some 17% of respondents were placed under ERTE regulations, by which they were temporarily laid off and had access to unemployment benefits paid by the Spanish Government.












### Share of the population that practiced social distancing due to coronavirus (COVID-19) in Spain as of March 2020, by age group













# Weekly percentage change in the digital advertising investment due to the coronavirus crisis in Spain as of March 29th, 2020, by sector










# IMF Expects Swift Recovery **After COVID-19 Contraction**






